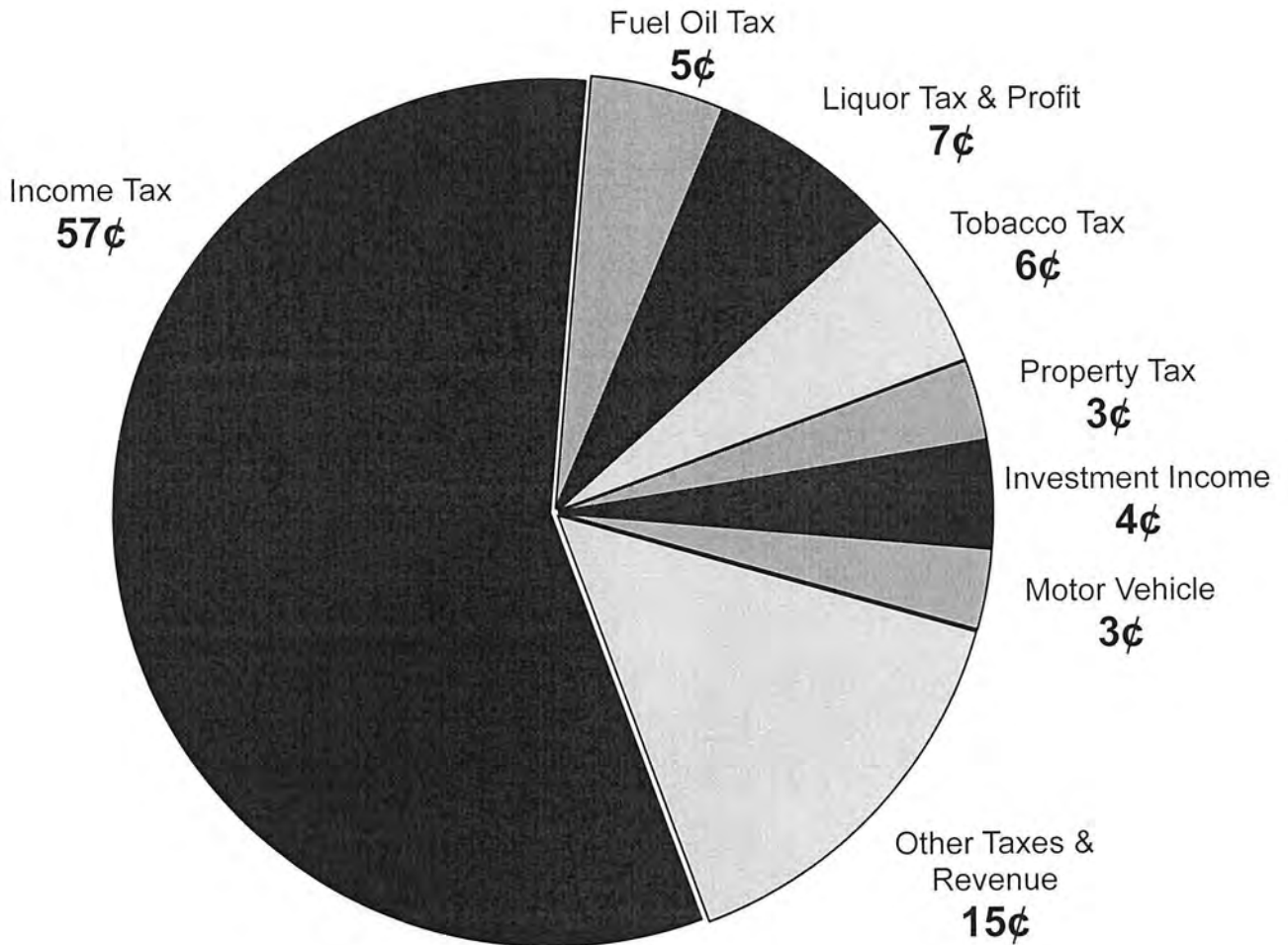

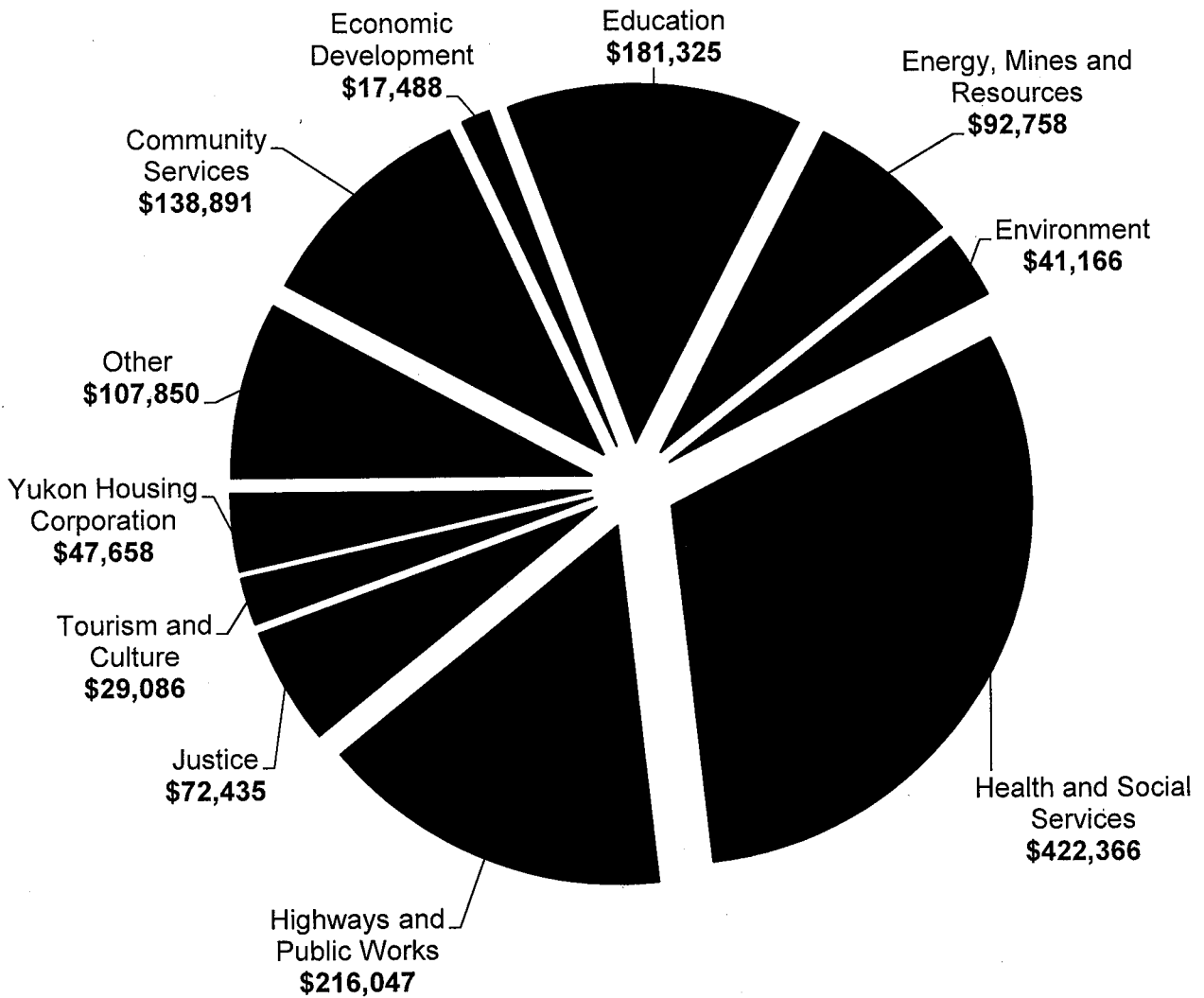
- (1) Rate changes may have occurred since the time of the survey (March, 2015). Reference should be made to each jurisdiction's Department of Finance to determine current rates or upcoming rate changes.
- (2) Income tax brackets are indexed using the Consumer Price Index in New Brunswick, Saskatchewan, Northwest Territories, Nunavut, and Yukon.
- (3) The following jurisdictions levy a surcharge on personal income tax: Prince Edward Island - 10% of provincial tax in excess of \$12,500; Ontario - 20% of provincial tax in excess of \$4,418 and 36% of provincial tax in excess of \$5,654.
- (4) Provincial share of Harmonized Sales Tax for Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Ontario. Prince Edward Island adopted HST effective April 1, 2013. British Columbia reverted back from HST to a provincial sales tax effective April 1, 2013.
- (5) Yukon - Effective January 1, 2015 personal income tax rates changed from 7.04%, 9.68%, 11.44%, 12.76%, a new threshold and rate for income over \$500,000 was introduced and the high income threshold was revoked. Effective July 1, 2014 small business rate decreased from 4% to 3%.
- (6) Northwest Territories - Two tax rates exist for gasoline - for highway usage (10.7 cents per litre) and for off-highway usage (6.4 cents per litre). The 6.4 cent rate applies for communities not on the highway system.
- (7) Nunavut - Two tax rates exist for gasoline - for highway usage (10.7 cents per litre) and for off-highway usage (6.4 cents per litre).
- (8) British Columbia - For 2015 tax year a temporary tax bracket and rate is in place: 16.8% on taxable income over \$151,050. General Corporate tax rate was increased from 10% to 11% effective April 1, 2013. Tobacco tax rate increased from 22.3 cents per cigarette effective April 1, 2014. Fuel tax rates are for fuel on highways and include carbon tax rates of 6.67 cents per litre for gas and 7.67 cents per litre for diesel. Rates do not include regional taxes.
- (9) Saskatchewan - Tobacco tax increased from 21 cents per cigarette effective March 21, 2013.
- (10) Manitoba - Effective July 1, 2013 the Provincial Sales Tax increased from 7.0%. Effective April 16, 2013 tobacco tax increased from 25 cents per cigarette.
- (11) Ontario - General corporate income tax rate freeze took effect for 2012 until budget is balanced; scheduled to be balanced in 2017-18 at which time rate will be further reduced to 11% and to 10% July 1 each year. Effective January 1, 2014 the top personal income tax rate was increased from 12.16% for a new threshold of income above \$220,000. A new PIT rate of 12.16% was added for income between \$150,000 and \$220,000. Tobacco tax increased from 12.35 cents per cigarette effective May 2, 2014.
- (12) Quebec - Effective January 1, 2013 a new top personal income tax bracket and rate was introduced. Quebec Sales Tax increased from 9.5% effective January 1, 2013. Effective April 1, 2013 gasoline and diesel tax rates increased 1 cent per litre. Gasoline rate includes 0.8 cent per litre carbon tax; diesel rate includes 0.9 cent per litre carbon tax. Tobacco tax increased from 12.9 cents per cigarette effective June 5, 2014.
- (13) New Brunswick - Effective July 1, 2013 all four personal income tax rates were increased from 9.10%, 12.10%, 12.40% and 14.30% respectively. Effective July 1, 2013 the general corporate income tax rate was increased from 10%. Effective January 1, 2015 the small business rate was decreased from 4.5%. On April 17, 2013 tobacco tax increased from 17 cents per cigarette.
- (14) Prince Edward Island - Effective April 1, 2013 the taxes levied on gasoline and diesel sold in Prince Edward Island were changed from a blended tax (fixed plus ad valorem rate) to a fixed rate of tax. With the implementation of HST on April 1, 2013 tobacco tax was decreased from 25.4 cents per cigarette, gasoline tax was decreased from 15.8 cents per litre and the small business rate was increased from 1%.
- (15) Nova Scotia - Small business rate was reduced from 3.5% effective January 1, 2014. Effective April 5, 2013 cigarette tax was increased from 21.52 cents per cigarette.
- (16) Newfoundland & Labrador - Effective July 1, 2014 small business rate was decreased from 3%. Effective March 28, 2014 cigarette tax was increased from 20.5 cents per cigarette.

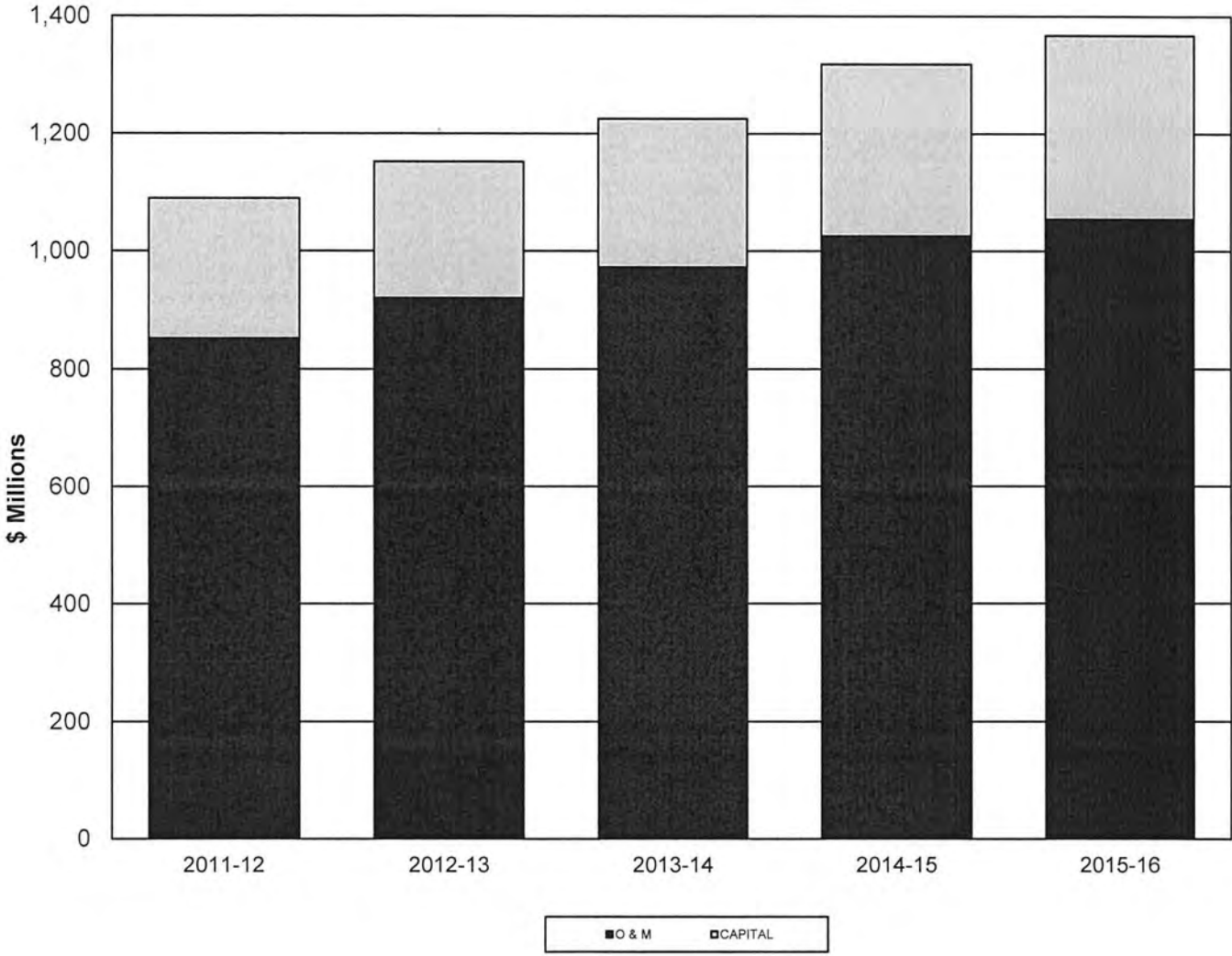
